


#### FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Friends of St Stephen's

Never was a sense of community more important than when our St Stephen's family mourned the loss of one of our year ten students (Angus Poggioli) and prayed for the recovery of another student (Daniel Cross), also in year ten, who suffered severe burns in the tragic accident that claimed Angus' life. I am very grateful for the support which our staff and counsellors from Catholic Education Services provided to students in the days following the accident. The entire St Stephen's community extends its sincere condolences to Angus' family as we keep them in our thoughts and prayers at this difficult time. We also wish his cousin, Daniel, the very best during his road to recovery.

This sense of community is celebrated on 21 September when the entire school comes together for St Stephen's Day. Not only is the day dedicated to remembering our patron, St Stephen, but it is also an opportunity for fostering positive relationships in our pastoral groups and across the college. All parents are very welcome to attend, for all or part of the day which begins with a whole school mass, followed by a cultural performance by our students, a mini-fete and the competitive netball game between the senior students and the staff. For many students this is the best day of the school year and I urge parents to delay their holiday plans until the start of the official break on 22 September, so that students can enjoy being with their peers, celebrating the spirit of our college. Attendance is compulsory and students are to be attired in their sports uniform.

Congratulations are extended to the year seven and nine students for their efforts on the NAPLAN test, the results of which are being sent home to parents. It is important to remember that this test is just one measure of a student's performance at a point in time and assists the school to determine areas that require attention. Students performed well on the test; in particular, the writing task was of a very high standard and I thank the English teachers for working effectively to improve writing across the board. The year twelve students are also to be commended for their commitment to the Queensland Core Skills Test on 4 and 5 September.

While many students have worked very hard this term and are looking forward to the holidays, school officially concludes on Friday 21 September at 3.00 pm. The last week of term is devoted to completing assessment and preparing students for term four. Year ten students are engaging in work experience for the first four days of the last week and our college will be hosting students from our sister school in Japan from 14 September to 21 September. There is also great excitement about the forthcoming New Zealand trip which four teachers and twenty-four students are undertaking in the first ten days of the holidays. I thank our teachers for their generosity in giving up their break time and wish the entire group a wonderful time in the snow.

Schools are a microcosm of society with highs and lows. Over the past ten weeks of term three, our community has celebrated many great achievements by our students, of whom we are very proud. #### Gastroenteritis

Queensland Health, Tropical Public Health Services (Cairns) TPHS (Cairns) has received a number of reports in recent weeks of outbreaks of gastroenteritis in schools.

Symptoms can include:

- Diarrhoea and /or
- Vomiting
- Abdominal cramps
- Fever
- Headaches

To help prevent further outbreaks we advise that any child or staff member who is displaying the above symptoms must not attend school until they are symptom free and completely well for a minimum of 48 hours. If your child is unwell with the above symptoms and does not appear to be getting better, you should seek medical attention and ask your doctor to consider taking a stool sample.

Gastroenteritis can be passed from person to person very easily by:

- Direct person to person contact
- Airborne spread when a person vomits (when large numbers of viruses pass into the air as an invisible mist and can infect other people in the area)
- Swallowing something that has been contaminated through contact with infected faeces or vomit.

Students who need to relocate to Cairns or Townsville may be eligible for an accommodation 'top up' of \$1,500 paid in the first year of study.

\*Eligible courses include all undergraduate bachelor and joint degrees offered by JCU excluding the Bachelor of Dental Surgery, Bachelor of Veterinary Sciences and Bachelor of Medicine and Surgery. The scholarship is paid in two instalments per year over three years).

## JCU Deans' Scholarship

The Deans' Scholarship seeks to support eligible students committed to making a difference in their chosen profession in tropical or underserved communities.

The Deans' Scholarship provides financial support to high-achieving students for the length of their degree, allowing students to fully commit to their studies. The value of the scholarship is \$10,000 per year, for the minimum number of years expected to complete their chosen course on a full-time basis. Six scholarships are offered each year.
