Uniform

It is fitting this week as we reflect on ANZAC Day, that we recognise the bravery of men and women who have served our country. Associated with these courageous Australians is the uniform that they wear with pride and all that it stands for.



This week on assembly I spoke to our student body regarding the values that are inherent in the St Stephen's College uniform. Our College uniform stands out in the community, as do our students. Students of our College were reminded of the values attached to our uniform including that of integrity, courage and honesty.

Integrity was framed to the students as, "doing what you said you would do when you said you would do it". Students were challenged to be courageous, to make morally autonomous decisions even if they are unpopular. The final value portrayed was honesty, explained as, "doing the right thing even when no-one is watching". It is the display of these values by our students that help create a great school.

Pastoral Challenge

We are all busy people. Our days are usually packed. We are generally good at helping people, if it is on our calendar. Unfortunately, I think I often miss people who need help – but do not ask for it – when I rush through my day, moving from task to task. Like Jesus, I need to be on the lookout for people who need me.

How about us? How often do people pass us who feel like they have lost everything? Do we keep our eyes open for them? Do we ask God for the vision to see them and the grace to help them? Or do we rush through the day focused on what is next in our world?

Christians are called to be on the lookout for people who suffer. Ask God to focus your vision beyond your schedule. Look for those who come across your path. Reach out.

What action are we called to take?

Reach out and help. As you walk through your week, pay attention to those around you. Do you see anyone in need? If there is something you can do to ease their pain, reach out to them. You may send an encouraging card or give someone a smile. You can open doors for someone or help another carry a heavy load. Even a listening ear can be a great comfort.

Reminder regarding Mobile Phones (as per Student Record Book)

"Mobile phones are to be stored in lockers and switched off. The College will contact parents, on a student's behalf, if a call needs to be made during the school day. FROM THE MIDDLE LEADER PASTORAL - YEAR 8

Welcome back to term two. I hope that your family had time to enjoy the Easter break and that all students were able to rest and recharge over the break. By now, you have received your child's interim report card and this is a great opportunity to encourage them to look at setting and working towards attainable goals for term two and identify clear actions that can be made to further learning progress. In addition to your child-parent conversation, parent-teacher interviews are a great opportunity to communicate with your child's teacher and hear how they are tracking academically and with their behaviour and work ethic in class.



Parent-Teacher interviews were held last night (Wednesday 26 April). Communicating with your child's teacher is not just about attending a one night parent-teacher interview, but staying in touch throughout the year to create a positive two-way relationship by sending emails or adding comments in the Student Record Book (SRB). Above all, remember that it is a three-way relationship between you, your child and their teacher and that only by working together positively can you help your child achieve their full potential.

It is essential that students make full use of the SRB. This diary is helpful to everyone and important in the following ways:

- Students note down homework and assessment and due dates.
- Record upcoming school events.
- Manage their workload and keep track of what needs to be completed and when.
- Parents can know various activities of the school, their children's progress, teacher comments and homework given to the child, etc.
- The SRB is helpful to a teacher as a communication tool.
- In the SRB, school rules, policies and procedures are included, as well as, tips for organisation and time management, how to manage stress, editing and study tips and goal setting.

The SRB in secondary school is probably the most important book that students will need and it is vital that every child keeps all of their information organised. If a child can use their SRB properly, they should be able to stay organised and have a less stressful year. Please sign your child's SRB at the end of each week.

Many students have been involved in extra-curricular activities throughout term one and the start of term two. Students have participated in District Swimming Carnival, the Bill Turner Soccer tournament, and will be attending the District Cross Country later in the week. Thank you to the year eight students involved with Army Cadets, Combined School Band and the ANZAC Day ceremony in Mareeba or their local area.

Pride in the school uniform is something we take seriously at St Stephen's. There are a couple of uniform reminders that have been discussed with students of late. Please check the SRB on pages 8 and 9 for uniform and grooming policy.

- 1. Hair ties and ribbons are to be school colours only (white, beige or navy blue). If girls wish to use the more common black or brown hair ties, they need to be covered with a white, beige or navy blue ribbon.
- 2. A plain fine metal neck chain with a Christian religious medal or crucifix is permitted.
